Uganda & Kenya Renew Bonds at Joint Ministerial Commission.

Kampala – Uganda and Kenya successfully concluded the 2nd session of the Joint Ministerial Commission (JMC) at the Sheraton Hotel in Kampala, underscoring their renewed commitment to fostering strong bilateral relations. The JMC, held from May 12 to May 14, 2024, witnessed the participation of Uganda's Minister of Foreign Affairs, Hon. Gen. Odongo Jeje Abubakhar, and Kenya's Prime Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Secretary for Foreign & Diaspora Affairs, Rt. Hon. Dr. Musalia Mudavadi. The ministers praised the relentless efforts of officials from both countries in making the meeting a reality, attributing the previous delay of the scheduled 2021 JMC to the Covid-19 pandemic.

acknowledged the longstanding They historical, economic, and socio-cultural ties between Uganda and Kenya, which predate their independence. The Discussions comprehensively tackled bilateral cooperation and security, as well as economic and socio-cultural sectors. The Uganda-Kenya JMC meeting culminated in a state visit by H.E. President Yoweri Museveni to Nairobi, where he was warmly welcomed by H.E. President William Samoei Ruto.

At the conclusion of the JMC meeting, Hon. Gen. Odongo and Rt. Hon. Dr. Mudavadi signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on cooperation between the Foreign Service Academy of Kenya and Uganda's Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Additionally, Uganda and Kenya signed the following MOUs: Public Service Management & Development, Cooperation in the Field of Sports, On Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises, In the Field of Youth Affairs, In the Field of Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment, and Cooperation in Education, Training & Scientific Research. Kenya will host the third session of the JMC in 2026.



Entebbe – On Thursday, May 23, 2024, Uganda's Ministry of Foreign Affairs successfully repatriated citizens who were victims of human trafficking in Southeast Asia, Myanmar. This achievement underscores the ministry's commitment to protecting Ugandans abroad and combating human trafficking. The Permanent Secretary of the Ministry, Mr. Bagiire Vincent Waiswa, expressed gratitude to Ambassador Betty Oyella Bigombe, Uganda's Ambassador to Thailand, for her crucial efforts in ensuring the victims' return. Mr. Bagiire urged Ugandans to be cautious of suspicious job offers and reassured that the ministry is collaborating with government agencies and international partners, such as the International Organisation for (IOM), to prevent human Miaration trafficking. The successful repatriation followed intense diplomatic negotiations and determined efforts. During the 19th Summit of the Non-Aligned Movement in Kampala, Minister Hon. John Mulimba and Ambassador Dr. Betty Bigombe discussed the safety and extraction of the Ugandan citizens with Myanmar's Deputy Foreign Minister, H.E. U Than Swe. The case came to light with reports of 23 Ugandans being held captive in Myanmar, coerced into cryptocurrency schemes and trafficked with false promises of high-paying jobs.

PS Bagiire extended deep appreciation to IOM for their critical support in providing shelter and helping the victims recover and reintegrate. The victims highlighted the significant support of President Yoweri Kaguta Museveni and the tireless efforts of Ambassador Dr. Betty Bigombe in achieving this outcome.

President Museveni Mourns the Passing of Iranian President Raisi

Kampala – President Yoweri Kaguta Museveni mourned the late President of Iran, H.E. Ebrahim Raisi, lauding him as a unifier and a dedicated leader. H.E. the President delivered these remarks at the Embassy of the Islamic Republic of Iran in Kampala while honoring H.E. Raisi, who tragically died on May 19, 2024, alongside Iran's Minister of Foreign Affairs H.E. Dr. Hossein Amir-Abdollahian and several other officials in a helicopter crash near the village of Uzi in East Azerbaijan province. In his heartfelt address, President Museveni (pictured in white shirt) extended his condolences to the Iranian people, emphasizing Uganda's solidarity with Iran during this difficult time. He pledged continued collaboration between Uganda and Iran for the mutual benefit of both nations. "As I have written in the book here, we have been dealing with Iranian leaders ever since we came into government," he noted. H.E. Majid Saffar, Ambassador of Iran to Uganda, expressed deep



gratitude for President Museveni's support, describing it as a testament to the strong friendship and unity between Uganda and Iran. "Your Excellency, we are deeply grateful to you for standing with us during this time of remembrance and reflection. Your assistance is extremely important to the Iranian people. May the memories of our martyrs inspire us to work together for a brighter and more peaceful future," Ambassador Saffar stated. Following the tragic incident, H.E. Mohammad Mokhber, the First Vice-President, has assumed the responsibilities of President in accordance with the Iranian Constitution, To ensure leadership continuity, Mr. Ali Bagheri Kani, Deputy Foreign Minister for Political Affairs, has been appointed acting Foreign Minister. The commemoration ceremony was attended by Mr. Vincent Bagiire Waiswa, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, along with other Ugandan and Iranian officials.

The event highlighted the importance of integrating technology within the cultural sector. Dr. Mudrugo Dominic, Deputy Secretary of the Uganda National Commission for UNESCO (UNATCOM), emphasized the role of cultural positioning in ending

Uganda and Czech Republic Hold Bilateral Consultations.

Kampala - A delegation from the Czech Republic, led by Ms. Katerina Sequensova, Director General Non-European for Countries, Economic and Development Cooperation, embarked on a five-day consultative visit to Uganda to enhance bilateral cooperation. The delegation was warmly received by Amb. Elly Kamahungye, Director for Regional and International Economic Affairs, at the Ministry HQ. During their discussions, Amb. Kamahungye and Ms. Sequensova highlighted the close and friendly ties between Uganda and the Czech Republic. Both parties acknowledged the significant potential of their bilateral relations and reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening cooperation across various including political, sectors, economic, health, defense, education, scientific, and social areas. The Czech Republic commended Uganda for its substantial contribution to regional peace and security and praised Uganda's open-door policy for accepting refugees. Both sides agreed on the importance of defense cooperation for prosperity and committed to enhancing collaboration in this sector. Additionally, the two nations expressed interest in building tourism cooperation, with the Czech Republic inviting Uganda to participate in the Annual Holiday Fair in the first quarter of 2025. The meeting was attended by heads of departments from MoFA, as well as senior officials from the Ministry of Education and Sports and the Ministry of Energy & Mineral Development.

In a groundbreaking blend of sports and diplomacy, the American Football Federation of Uganda (AFFU) has teamed up with the Young Diplomats of Uganda (YDU) to transform the diplomatic landscape. YDU, a non-profit network, is dedicated to shaping the next generation of leaders and diplomats. Through this partnership with AFFU, YDU provides young Ugandans with unparalleled opportunities in sports and international relations.

This unique partnership offers aspiring young Ugandan football players professional training, marking a significant stride in both athletic prowess and international relations. The Annual Football Camp 2024; A Game Changer: On March 10, 2024, the annual flag football camp kicked off at Destiny Bridge Academy in Wakiso, bringing together enthusiastic children aged seven to sixteen. Part of AFFU's initiative to incorporate flag football into national school games, the camp featured exhilarating warm-up exercises and intense training sessions. The young participants, thrilled by the game, expressed heartfelt gratitude to AFFU, YDU, and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for this unforgettable experience.



Of the 32 recognised teams by the NFL, Uganda currently boasts 3 (three) internationally-recognized players: Tanoh Kpassagnon, New Orleans Saints, NFL; Joshua Akena, Haux, German Football League; and Ojok Simba, NFL Academy, UK. In August, AFFU will host a thrilling two-day event, focusing on awareness and training athletic boys and girls. They aim to launch a league for ages 14 to 18, starting with at least six players.

AFFU's Mission: Olympic Glory and Beyond:



The Games of the XXXIII Olympiad commonly known as "the 2024 Summer Olympics" or simply "Paris 2024" will be held from 26 July - 11 August 2024 in France with Paris as the main host city and 16 others cities within France including the island of Tahiti, a French overseas country. Paris has hosted the Games previously in 1900 and 1924, and by hosting the XXXIII Olympiad in 2024 will join London, also renown to have hosted the Games 3 times, in 1908, 1948 and 2012. The Games will be exactly 100 years from the last hosting in 1924, which indeed is remarkable. The Summer Olympic will return to the traditional 4-year cycle after the 2020 Tokyo postponed to 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Opening Ceremony is scheduled to take place on Friday, 26 July 2024, and for the first time, will not be hosted in a stadium as tradition has been. The opening will feature a 6kilomter "parade of nations" conducted as a boat parade along the River Seine with cultural presentations and views of Paris landmarks, and has promises to be one of the most spectacular ceremonies in Olympic history.

Paris 2024 will feature 329 events, 32 sports including the 28 "core" Olympic sports contested at Rio 2026 & London 2020, and four additional sports proposed by the Paris Organizing Committee of the International Olympic Committee (IOC), i.e. Breaking or Breakdance, that will be debuting, Skateboarding, Sport Climbing and Surfing that first appeared at Tokyo 2020. 10, 500 athletes will

take part in Paris 2024 and this edition will be the first to feature an identical number of men and women athletes The Games will mark the last to be held under the leadership of current IOC President Dr. Thomas Bach, and are estimated to cost €8.3 Billion.

Olympic athletes inspire people of all ages to pursue their dreams and strive excellence. Their stories for of perseverance motivate individuals to overcome challenges and emphasize the importance of physical fitness and healthy living. Hosting the Olympics can boost tourism and attract investment, leading to economic growth. The infrastructure developed for the Games, such as sports facilities, transportation, and accommodation, provides long-term benefits, creating many job opportunities. Olympics foster national pride and community spirit, bringing people together to support their athletes. Their legacy includes improved infrastructure, enhanced sports facilities, and increased sports participation. The recent focus on sustainability promotes environmentally friendly games' practices and awareness.

Beyond Games, The Olympics are more than a celebration of athletic prowess; they embody human potential and global cooperation. Here are key points highlighting their broader significance: The Olympics bring athletes from around the world together, fostering international friendship and understanding. They serve as a diplomatic tool, easing tensions and promoting dialogue and cooperation among nations. The Games celebrate cultural diversity, with the host country showcasing its traditions while participating nations share their heritage, promoting mutual respect and appreciation for different cultures.

Uganda first participated in the Olympics in 1956 and has competed in every edition since, except for the 1976 boycott. The Tokyo 2020 Olympics marked Uganda's most successful campaign to date, with a total of four medals. As the qualification period for Paris 2024 continues, Uganda Olympic Committee expects to field athletes in Aquatics (Swimming), Athletics (Track & Field), Cycling, and Rowing. Boxing and Rugby are also in the process of securing qualification slots from upcoming international competitions. Countdown to the final 50 days will be celebrated on June 6, 2024, in Kampala. During this event, names of the qualified athletes, Uganda's corporate partners, and the Paris 2024 Nike uniform will be unveiled.





Uganda Tourism Board and Emirates Sign MOU to Promote Uganda's Tourism.

The Uganda Tourism Board and Emirates Airlines on Wednesday 8th May 2024 signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to drive inbound tourism and boost visitors to Uganda, the Pearl of Africa. Through this partnership with the Uganda Tourism Board, we are solidifying our commitment to driving international travellers to experience Uganda's stunning natural landscapes where some of the world's most exotic wildlife roam free, thrilling adventure sports and activities and, of course, the warm hospitality that characterises Ugandan culture."

Under the MoU, Emirates will identify key markets to promote Uganda as a favourable tourism destination and encourage travellers to experience its abundant natural, cultural and adventure attractions.

The Uganda Tourism Board will in turn work closely with the Airline to develop programmes for trade partners, hoteliers and tour operators to stimulate the industry. Uganda's Economic Diplomacy in Southern Africa: A Path to Prosperity.

(*M* a concerted effort to strengthen economic ties and foster collaboration, the Uganda High Commission in Pretoria has intensified on a transformative journey of engagement with Southern African nations under its jurisdiction. This strategic initiative marks a monumental step towards not just economic growth but also enhanced diplomatic relations between Uganda and its regional partners.

In the case of Botswana, renewed efforts of this journey can be traced back to a landmark meeting between President Yoweri Kaguta Museveni and his Botswana counterpart President Dr. Mokgweetsi Eric Keabetswe Masisi at the G77+ China Summit in Kampala on January 21, 2024. This encounter laid a concrete groundwork for a series of dynamic developments aimed at bolstering bilateral and economic relations between the two countries.

One of the standout moments in this burgeoning partnership occurred on February 9, 2024, following a directive from Botswana's President, H.E Mokgweetsi Masisi. This directive set in motion a mission wherein a delegation from the Botswana Vaccines Institute, coordinated by the Uganda High Commission in Pretoria and led by the Institute's CEO, Mr. Andrew Madeswi, ventured to Uganda. Their objective was to collect blood samples from regions affected by foot and mouth disease in Uganda, with the ultimate aim of developing tailor-made vaccines to combat this agricultural challenge, underscoring a spirit of collaborative advancement in the agricultural sector. Further deepening this alliance, a high-level delegation from Uganda's Ministry of Agriculture, Animal Industry, and Fisheries, spearheaded by Hon. Bright Rwamirama, State Minister for Animal Industry, flanked by the MAAIF Permanent Secretary Gen. Kasura-Kyomukama engaged in a five-day working exchange visit in April 2024.

This visit, augmented by key stakeholders from NAGRIC, Makerere University, and NARO, resulted in pivotal agreements, including the procurement of Botswana FMD vaccines by Uganda. A significant delivery of one million doses is anticipated in the coming months, signifying a shared commitment to cooperation on animal disease control and assisted reproduction technologies. Discussions during the visit encompassed a wide spectrum of collaboration areas, including the importation of Ugandan agricultural products such as milk, cereals, coffee, tea, and fruits into Botswana. Plans were set in motion to establish animal feed production facilities in Uganda in partnership with both private and public sector entities, aimed at bolstering animal genetics and elevating product quality standards-a comprehensive approach to economic partnership.

The High Commission of Uganda in Pretoria, with additional accreditation in Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Namibia, and Zimbabwe, has been at the forefront of facilitating bilateral and commercial relations with these regions. A notable success has been the flourishing trade ties between Uganda and South Africa, with leading South African companies establishing regional bases in Uganda, thus fostering job creation and spurring economic development. Efforts are firmly underway to cultivate a balanced trade relationship, with a specific emphasis on exporting Ugandan products to the Southern African market. Impressive headway has been made by Mr. Andrew Mukiibi of Federal Foods Pty Ltd in exporting fruits such as bananas, pineapples, and avocados to South Africa, generating substantial interest in Ugandan agricultural products. Mr. Mukiibi has already established a cold room in Kempton Park, Johannesburg as a key Ugandan Foods market.

As Uganda continues to stride forward in its economic pursuits in Southern Africa, a promising horizon unfolds, characterized by collaborative economic and diplomatic endeavors by our Mission that lay the groundwork for mutual growth and prosperity in the region.

Mombasa – In a vibrant celebration of culture and diplomacy, the Consulate General of Uganda in Mombasa, in collaboration with stakeholders from both Uganda and the Kenya Coast, organized the inaugural Uganda Festival from April 17–20, 2024, across Mombasa, Kwale, and Kilifi counties. The festival, themed "Leveraging Culture to Promote Tourism, Trade, and Investment between Uganda and the Kenya Coast," showcased the unique attractions and opportunities Uganda has to offer.

Kenya remains Uganda's top source market for visitors, with **over 490,000 Kenyans visiting in 2023**. The Uganda Festival sets a new benchmark for cultural diplomacy, promising unity, cultural exchange, and mutual growth.






Real Estate & Hospitality Sector Gets Major Boost in Uganda.

Dubai – Uganda's real estate and hospitality (tourism) sectors are set for significant upgrades, thanks to investments from Reportage Properties (RP) and Haliburg Group.

Transforming Urban Landscapes: Mobilized by the Consulate General in Dubai, UAE, Reportage Properties (RP) is redefining urban living in Kamwokya and Bukoto. With a strong presence in the UAE, Italy, Russia, and Saudi Arabia, RP is now making strides in Kampala's metropolitan area. RP's initial projects include deluxe apartments in Kamwokya, already 90% sold out, and an ultramodern apartment block in Bukoto on NHCC land. These developments aim to address Uganda's severe housing shortage, which stood at 2.4 million units in 2021 and has likely increased due to urbanization and population growth. RP's CEO, Andrea Nucera, committed to this investment after a delegation led by Mr. Alkesh Rajput met with President Yoweri Museveni. The President encouraged collaboration with the National Housing and Construction Corporation (NHCC) to spur real estate development.

RP's projects offer flexible payment methods, making housing more accessible. Headquartered in Kololo, Kampala, RP has also signed an MoU with NHCC (May 2, 2023), guiding their partnership in real estate development, construction, and infrastructure sectors.

Elevating Tourism: The Consulate General also facilitated the entry of One Nature Hotels & Resorts/Haliburg Group, led by CEO Engineer Hani Saliba. The group plans to develop two ultra-luxury 5-star resorts—one in Bwindi Impenetrable Forest and another in Queen Elizabeth National Park (QENP). In a meeting with President Museveni on March 5, 2024, the President directed the Ministry of Tourism, Wildlife, and Antiquities to identify suitable locations for these investments. Haliburg Group has since submitted a \$7 million proposal for a resort at Channel Track site within QENP to the Uganda Investment Authority. For the Bwindi resort, Haliburg Group's lawyers are negotiating terms with private landowners. Once finalized, the group will proceed with company registration and establishment of the resort.

These developments by Reportage Properties and Haliburg Group are set to enhance Uganda's urban living and tourism sectors, providing new opportunities for growth and prosperity.

Addis Ababa - Uganda's U20 junior team made a remarkable impression at the Zone 5 Challenge Trophy held in Addis Ababa from May 12 to 18, 2024. The team's journey began on May 2, 2024, as they arrived in Ethiopia to participate in the International Handball Federation (IHF) Zone 5 Challenge Trophy, organized by the Ethiopian Handball Federation. The young Ugandan team received a warm welcome from the Ethiopian authorities throughout their stay. They kicked off the tournament with a stellar performance, defeating Somalia 43:17 in their opening match and overpowering Tanzania 56:21 in the second match. Maintaining their winning momentum, Uganda secured a thrilling semi-final victory over the host nation, Ethiopia, with a score of 40:42. They then triumphed over Burundi, 43:27, setting the stage for an exciting final against Rwanda.

During their stay, the team visited Uganda's Embassy in Ethiopia, where they were warmly received by Amb. Rebecca Otengo Amuge, who hosted a dinner in their honor, attended by the Vice Chairperson of the Ugandan community and the entire Handball team. Mayanja William, Technical Director and Vice President of Ugandan Handball, presented Amb. Otengo with an official national team kit, nicknamed 'The KIKOOYI,' as a goodwill gesture. Amb. Otengo promised to place it on the Embassy's wall of fame. Despite their impressive performance, Uganda's winning streak ended in the final match against Rwanda. While they fell short of progressing to the continental challenge, finishing second in the tournament brought pride to many Ugandans. The Uganda junior team departed Addis Ababa on May 18, 2024, after the conclusion of the Zone 5 Challenge Trophy, leaving behind a legacy of hard work and sportsmanship.

Uganda Wins Award at the Annual Investment Meeting 2024.

Abu Dhabi - The prestigious award was presented to Hon. Evelyn Anite, Minister of State for Investment and Privatization at a gala dinner at the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre (ADNEC) as part of the 13th edition of the Annual Investment Meeting (AIM) on 8th May 2024. Uganda's winning projects included;

Nexus Green: A solar energy company that manufactures and supplies affordable solarpowered solutions designed for over 458 million people in the East African Region without access to reliable energy. It has invested over \$100 million, with \$10 million in the factory alone and employs 200 Ugandans directly and over 1,000 indirectly.

IMTN: A high-quality nature-based carbon removal project developer in Africa. It is on a mission to restore one million hectares of degraded land by 2030 through planting polyculture native bamboo with an emphasis on biodiversity management. Its current investment is \$1.5 million and planned investment of \$100M in the next four years.

Spouts of Water: The largest manufacturer of ceramic water filters in Africa, producing a convenient and affordable solution using locally sourced materials. The current investment value is \$10 million with an extra \$80 to \$100 million planned in the next four years. The project employs 450 Ugandans.

The highly competitive AIM award recognizes the accomplishments of a country in attracting the most significant investment projects that contribute to economic growth and development.

Uganda-Tanzania Business Forum Boosts Economic Ties



Dar es Salaam - The second edition of the Uganda-Tanzania Business Forum took place from May 23rd to 24th, 2024, at the Johari Rotana Hotel in Dar-es-Salaam, Tanzania, under the theme "Enhancing our win-win bilateral partnership." The event, organised by Uganda High Commission Dar es Salaam, and aimed at strengthening economic ties between the two nations, was officiated by Rt. Hon. Kassim Majaliwa Majaliwa, Prime Minister of the United Republic of Tanzania. Prime Minister Majaliwa encouraged participants to explore the diverse opportunities presented by regional collaboration, emphasizing the forum's role in bolstering bilateral ties between Uganda and Tanzania, and within the region at large. He reiterated the Tanzanian government's commitment to maintaining strong trade connections with Uganda.

Leading the Ugandan delegation, Minister of State for Regional Cooperation Hon. John Mulimba, highlighted the deep-rooted friendship and cooperation between the two countries. He underscored key partnership sectors and the transformative impact of the East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP) on citizens' livelihoods. "The World Bank projects that the EACOP project will generate \$20 billion in revenues for Uganda and Tanzania, creating over 10,000 jobs and immense opportunities for the private sector in various service sectors," said Hon. Mulimba.

Representatives from both governments and private sectors adopted the Declaration of the 2nd Uganda-Tanzania Business Forum 2024, which emphasized the need for the free movement of goods and services. The declaration also highlighted commitments by Uganda and Tanzania to address trade challenges, promote value addition, and strengthen trade linkages through joint ventures and investor missions.



Uganda Airlines Now Approved to Fly to UAE

Abu Dhabi - The General Civil Aviation Authority (GCAA) of the United Arab Emirates has given its approval to a request for Uganda Airlines to operate direct flights from Entebbe, Uganda to Abu Dhabi. The approval was conveyed on Wednesday 24 the April 2024 during a meeting between H.E. Zaake W. Kibedi, Ambassador of the Republic of Uganda to the United Arab Emirates and H.E. Omar Ghaleb, Deputy Director General of the GCAA. The approval was premised on the pre-condition that Uganda Airlines fulfils all the required formalities. The meeting was also attended by Mr. Deo Nyanzi, Manager Government Relations and Routes Coordination, Uganda Airlines, Mr. Daniel Wadada, First Secretary, Uganda Embassy, Abu Dhabi, and Mr. Hassan Ahmed Barman, Officer in Charge of Air Transport, strategy and International Affairs at the GCAA.

The approval of direct flights to Abu Dhabi marks an important milestone in the expansion of the fast-growing Uganda Airlines which is Uganda's flag carrier. The airline was revived in 2019 and currently has ten international routes.

The Phantom of the Opera, Uganda Edition Silences Skeptics.

"These guys must be out of their minds, bless their hearts," I thought with a private chuckle, when in February 2024 the official request for partnership from Executive Producers Kabiito Karamagi and Moses Mwase hit my in-tray. I had several preparatory meetings for what I felt were more pressing engagements and decided to re-read the document again "when I get a breather".

About a week later the follow-up phone call came from Kabiito and sure enough, he confirmed what the letter said. CompAction, the charity foundation of their Law Firm Ligomarc, together with a Production House called Timeless Arts, was staging a Ugandan adaptation of The Phantom of the Opera in May, at the National Theatre and they were seeking to deliver an invitation to creator and musical maestro, Sir Andrew Lloyd Webber, through the British High Commission, to come to Uganda and watch an adaptation of his classical musical production performed by an all-Ugandan cast accompanied by an all-Ugandan orchestra.

Cultural Cooperation and Public Diplomacy functions, with a spotlight on People to People Diplomacy, focusing on Education, Sports and Culture as vehicles of Bridging The Gap between countries. In Public Diplomacy, we get all kinds of correspondence on a daily basis that requires girding one's loins, so to speak. It often feels like we collect all the shots in the dark from desperate creatives in the shrinking space of the arts in Uganda.

When catchy phrases like Agriculture, Tourism, Minerals, Commercial Diplomacy, Regional Peace and Security are having their moment in the sun, Theatre, the Arts and Entertainment can feel pretty lightweight when vying for resources. However, as I sat across from the duo listening to their audacious project, over a cup of coffee, I did not just feel their energy and conviction, I felt, growing in my chest, the adrenaline of the underdog's kindredship. Succeeding at something very few would give a chance. Timeless Arts, was by no means doing this for the first time, having previously successfully staged Sir Bernard Shaw's My Fair Lady and Shakespeare's The Merchant of Venice. More than putting on the production though, it was the purpose that got me; Theatre For Mental Health. The proceeds will go to support the Special Olympics Uganda team. As a Ministry, supported by the Permanent Secretary, we jumped in with both feet and started knocking on doors right alongside them, ignoring the polite incredulity of one potential sponsor after another as they offered to "think about it".

Once in a while I privately questioned whether we had, in the city, let alone the entire country, the kind of resources and talent needed to do an adaptation of the original London Royal Theatre production justice. To understand the sheer audacity of what they were attempting to do, one needs a comparison. The Phantom of the Opera has sold over 100 million tickets since it was first staged in 1986, winning numerous awards that include the coveted Olivier and Tony awards and it is still showing every evening and twice on Saturdays, in London, with box office tickets selling for between £50-£200. In Africa, it has only had one adaptation in 1990 in South Africa. Who did Timeless Arts think they were to even look at the shoes, let alone think they could wear them? Even worse, with the advent of the internet and mobile phones, Theatrical productions have struggled in Uganda with an entire generation having never experienced what the inside of a Theatre is like. Who, in this city was going to part with 50k to watch an Amateur theatrical production? Fast forward to May 2024 as I received my velvet-like invitation, walked the red carpet and sat in the glammed up transformed, Kampala Conference Centre, for the Debut show, with tears in my eyes, listening to the thunderous Overture played by an all-Ugandan orchestra conducted by Kiggundu-Musoke, and the sweet soprano of Think of Me by Gloria Geria who plays Christine Daeé. I was proud to represent the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in supporting Theatre for Mental Health.

Ultimately, CompAction may not have succeeded in bringing over Sir Andrew, but they have won over Uganda's brutal skeptics. The show pulled corporate sponsorships from Uganda Breweries Ltd, Stanbic Bank, The New Vision and the Kampala Serena Hotel, Kampala Music School and the UNCC among others. It has provided paying jobs to the hundreds of actors, vocalists, instrumentalists, makeup artists, events companies, clothes and set designers, artists and carpenters that put it all together. It has shown to a full house every weekend this month, successfully closing on Sunday May 26th. Timeless Arts has given a new lease of life to Theatre in Uganda and we look forward to watching the next production bringing out of our literature text books, the African love triangle of Sidi, Lakunle and Baroka in, Wole Soyinka's The Lion and The Jewel, scheduled for October 2024. Dear corporate Uganda, pull out your checkbooks!

Alex Mukulu Woos Ugandans Back to the Theatre with a Trip Down Our National Memory Lane.

After exiting stage left 17 years ago, Alex Mukulu returned to the Ugandan performing arts scene at the end of March 2024 with a highly thoughtprovoking play called *Kulunkalu ne Kulumbisi: Yellow City vs. Red Ghetto*, staged at the Uganda National Cultural Centre and running until April 21, 2024—free of charge.

Referring to this play, which makes reference to two types of grasshoppers native to Uganda, simply as an African re-imagining of William Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet* does it a great disservice. *Kulunkalu ne Kulumbisi* is more than an African rendition of the famous feuding Montague and Capulet families.

Instead, this stinging satirical piece is a trip down Uganda's collective national memory lane through the lens of music, dance, and dialogue. Cleverly ensconced in a running dialogue between a Caucasian foreigner and an all-knowing Ugandan native, played by Alex Mukulu, *Kulunkalu ne Kulumbisi* positions the Ugandan native as the subject matter expert on events in his country—a notso-subtle dig at how foreigners are often deemed experts on African matters, especially in the international development and foreign affairs landscapes.

Mukulu, however, sensing that audience members may be driven to feeling guilty or satisfied at this presentation and interpretation of historical events, quickly flips the script by deftly illustrating that foreign agents cannot still be held responsible for many of the challenges post-colonial African states face today. So while there are several moments of hilarity, there are just as many uncomfortable moments—moments of truth.

Kulunkalu ne Kulumbisi, in true Mukulu style, unabashedly pokes at the national consciousness on current political and civil affairs in Uganda. This is overtly achieved in two ways: by depicting two feuding groups that wear red or yellow bandanas as their sign of fealty, and of course by having the second part of the play's title highlighted as *Yellow City vs. Red Ghetto*.

In addition to providing a much-appreciated and perhaps better-understood rendition of *Romeo and Juliet*, Mukulu draws the audience into how national affairs in one sphere of the world transcend to the rest of the world by using the now-famous plea from African American George Floyd, "I can't breathe"—but applying it to a wholly Ugandan context.

This subtle theme of suffocation in various dimensions of life could be said to be the connecting thread in the various scenes depicted in *Kulunkalu ne Kulumbisi*. From Colonial to Post-Colonial Uganda; from the deaths of Romeo and Juliet down to the two grasshoppers trapped in a container, the desire to not only live but thrive is clear.

After the final curtain fall, Alex Mukulu stepped out to address the audience and lamented the surging trend of passive digestion of content such as movies on Netflix or attending concerts, thereby evading –perhaps deliberately–active participation in changing our collective society for the better.

Kulunkalu ne Kulumbisi: Yellow City vs. Red Ghetto is a must-watch, even with all its uncomfortable moments. Every now and then, and especially amidst the plethora of entertainment options available today, a moment of introspection is required. If not to jolt one into considering becoming a change agent, then at least to cleanse one's mental palate.

Calls for Unity and Prosperity at Africa Day Commemoration.

Kampala - On May 25, 2024, Uganda joined other African nations in celebrating Africa Day at the Kololo Independence Grounds under the theme "Educate an African Fit for the 21st Century: Building Resilient Education Systems for Increased Access to Inclusive, Lifelong, Quality, and Relevant Learning in Africa." President Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, in a speech delivered by Minister of Defence and Veteran Affairs Hon. Jacob Marksons Oboth-Oboth, emphasized the importance of African solidarity and urged African states to avoid isolation. "Africa's future lies in unity and not isolation. As a Pan-Africanist, I take the issue of Africa's unity as a must. It is our only source of survival," said President Museveni. He called on Pan-Africanists to work towards political and economic integration to achieve liberation and freedom for all African states, recognizing the crucial role of young people in shaping Africa's future.


Reflecting on the race, Nakayi described the intense start and her need to stay composed until the perfect moment to unleash her pace.
